

Less Buildings more Mission needed says Archbishop of Dublin

Archbishop Dermot Farrell said that "the Church can't be reduced to buildings. The key thing in the Church is the proclamation of the Gospel. We have a total surplus of infrastructure which we don't actually need. The mission of the Church is to live the Gospel and to preach it."

During the month of April we had 19 funerals in our Parish which is very demanding on the limited number of Priests available, and which prevents the Clergy from visiting schools etc. This year 45 new lay catechists received their certificates, these are people from our parishes who are going to work in conjunction with the Priests throughout the Diocese who will help in the promotion of faith.

We thank you again for the generous contribution to the Lay Ministry Collection which in our parish amounted to €2,863.

Sunday's Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING Acts 1:1-11

A reading from the Acts of the Apostles. In my earlier work, Theophilus, I dealt with everything Jesus had done and taught from the beginning until the day he gave his instructions to the apostles he had chosen through the Holy Spirit, and was taken up to heaven. He had shown himself alive to them after his Passion by many demonstrations; for forty days he had continued to appear to them and tell them about the kingdom of God. When he had been at table with them, he had told them not to leave Jerusalem, but to wait there for what the Father had promised. "It is," he had said, "what you have heard me speak about: John baptised with water but you, not many days from now, will be baptised with the Holy Spirit."

Now having met together, they asked him, "Lord, has the time come? Are you going to restore the kingdom to Israel? He replied, "It is not for you to know the times or dates that the Father has decided by his own authority, but you will receive power when the Holy Spirit comes on you, and then you will be my witnesses not only in Jerusalem but throughout Judaea and Samaria, and indeed to the ends of the earth."

As he said this he was lifted up while they looked on, and a cloud took him from their sight. They were still staring into the sky when suddenly two men in white were standing near them and they said, "Why are you men from Galilee standing here looking into the sky? Jesus who has been taken up from you into heaven, this same Jesus will come back in the same way as you have seen him go there."

He has put all things under his feet, and made him, as the ruler of everything, the head of the Church; which is his body, the fullness of him who fills the whole creation.
