Seeing your Life through the Lens of the Gospel 26th May 2024—Feast of the Most Holy Trinity

- 1) It is time for Jesus to return to his Father. He meets his disciples for the last time. His final words give them direction for their future. Perhaps you can recall such parting moments in your own life – leaving home, school, college, training, the death of a loved one. What was that like for you? Were there words spoken then that gave you direction for your future?
- 2) Perhaps you can identify with Jesus in the story, when as a parent, teacher, or in some other way you sent someone on his/her way in life knowing you would not be with him or her as in the past. When did the way you parted help the other to make his, or her, own way in life?
- 3) Jesus told his disciples that although he would not be with them as in the past he would be with them in a new way right throughout their lives. Have there been times when you were reassured by the love and support of another even though s/he was not physically present with you?
- 4) In parting with his disciples Jesus gave them a mission for the future. Where, when, and how did you get a sense of the meaning and purpose of your own life? How does that sustain you now? Is there any way in which that purpose ties in with the mission given to the eleven to spread the Good News?
- 5) Jesus promised to be with his disciples until the end of time. It is a promise he would fulfil through the gift of the Holy Spirit. That promise is also given to us. What helps you to be aware of the presence of the Holy Spirit with you on life's journey?

Two New Auxiliary Bishops for Dublin

Donal Roche has been appointed Auxiliary Bishop of Dublin. He is a priest of the Dublin Diocese, a native of our neighbouring and partnership parish of Mourne Road, Drimnagh.



Donal was educated in Drimnagh Castle and Clonliffe College, he was ordained priest in June 1986. In recent years he served as Parish priest of Wicklow town before becoming PP of Cabinteely with responsibility for the developing area of Cherrywood in South Dublin. Donal Roche will be consecrated as Bishop on this Sunday Trinity Sunday at 3.00pm in St. Andrew's Church, Westland Row. You may watch the ceremony online at www.dublindiocese.ie.

The second Bishop is Paul Dempsey. He is at present Bishop of Achonry. Because of Rome's decision to reorganise some of the smaller Dioceses in the west of Ireland, Bishop Paul Dempsey is being transferred to Dublin which is by far the largest Diocese in the country.



Bishop Paul was born in Carlow, and spent his early days in Athy which is in the Dublin Diocese. Bishop Paul brings the fruit and wisdom of his extensive pastoral experience, as priest and bishop to the leadership of the Church in Dublin.

All Ireland Rosary Rally - Knock Saturday, June 1st

Join thousands of people from around Ireland and beyond for the All Ireland Rosary Rally on June 1st. The day begins at 9.30am with a Conference in St. John's Centre.

Speakers include Fr Brendan Kilcoyne, Fr Joseph Mary Deane CFR, and Sr Ana Margarita Lanzas SCTJM. Then there is a chance to meet over 20 apostolates from around Ireland in St John Centre from 1130am. The keynote speaker, Mother Adela Galindo, is coming from Miami, Florida, and she will speak in the Basilica at 1pm. The Stations of the Cross will be outside from 2pm, followed by the Rosary procession. Mass will commence at 3pm in the Basilica and will include the anointing of the sick. Bishop Phonsie Cullinan will be the Main Celebrant. Dana will join the choir to sing. There will also be rosary and scapular making workshops in the marquee.
