

Sunday's Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING Ex. 24:3-8

A reading from the book of Exodus.

Moses went and told the people all the commands of the Lord and all the ordinances. In answer, all the people said with one voice: "We will observe all the commands that the Lord has decreed." Moses put all the commands of the Lord into writing, and early next morning he built an altar at the foot of the mountain, with twelve standing-stones for the twelve tribes of Israel. Then he directed certain young Israelites to offer holocausts and to immolate bullocks to the Lord as communion sacrifices. Half of the blood Moses took up and put into basins, the other half he cast on the altar. And taking the Book of the Covenant he read it to the listening people, and they said, "We will observe all that the Lord has decreed; we will obey." Then Moses took the blood and cast it towards the people. "This," he said "is the blood of the Covenant that the Lord has made with you, containing all these rules."

The blood of goats and bulls and the ashes of a heifer are sprinkled on those who have incurred defilement and they restore the holiness of their outward lives; how much more effectively the blood of Christ, who offered himself as the perfect sacrifice to God, through the eternal Spirit, can purify our inner self from dead actions so that we do our service to the living God.

Follow him, and say to the owner of the house which he enters, 'The Master says: Where is my dining room in which I can eat the Passover with my disciples?" And as they were eating he took some bread, and when he had said the blessing he broke it and gave it to them. "Take it," he said "this is my body." Then he took a cup, and when he had returned thanks he gave it to them, and all drank from it, and he said to them, "This is my blood, the blood of the covenant, which is to be poured out for many. I tell you solemnly, I shall not drink any more wine until the day I drink the new wine in the kingdom of God."

FEAST OF CORPUS CHRISTI - THE BODY AND BLOOD OF CHRIST

One of the great traditions in the past in towns and cities was the annual Corpus Christi procession with large numbers, all gathering to give reverence and devotion to the Blessed Sacrament as it was carried through the streets, accompanied by prayers, singing and blessings. It was a feature of my childhood and teenage years. Looking back now, it was a very different world. There are parishes where the procession still occurs but our modern society has forced us to literally go into hiding! More and more, the expressions of our Christian beliefs and faith are being challenged, with many arguing that in a modern democracy - multicultural and more secular we should keep our religion within the walls of our homes and churches. We all witness the lessening of congregations in our Christian churches, Catholic or otherwise. Soon, as the late Pope Emeritus Benedict XV1 once said, "we'll just be a remnant Church", by which he meant we will become a smaller religious group. Those of us who choose to stay with our Catholic faith and practices are more and more challenged to be "salt of the earth" and "light of the world" as Jesus asks of us in the gospels.

One of the central mysteries of our Catholic faith is the EUCHARIST. At the Last Supper. Jesus gave his whole person, his body and blood, to his disciples under the form of bread and wine. Taking the bread, he blessed it, broke it and gave it to his disciples, saying, "THIS IS MY BODY". Then taking a cup of wine, he blessed it and gave it to the disciples, saying, "THIS IS THE NEW COVENANT IN MY BLOOD". This self-giving of Jesus at the Last Supper under the form of bread and wine anticipated his total gift of himself to his disciples and to the world on the cross the following day. Jesus gave himself for all of us and wanted this gift of himself to be personal for each one of us.

So, why do we gather week after week? Simply, as we are told in the Eucharistic Prayers - to keep the memory of Jesus alive by gathering together to "break bread". Whatever else we do as followers of Jesus, we must remember to eat in his name, which is what we do at every Eucharist. The Eucharist is a thanksgiving for what Jesus has done. We gather to hold his memory sacred and holy. What a beautiful gift the Eucharist is for us! In celebrating the Eucharist, we are drawn more deeply into life with God through Jesus. Jesus is our principal entrance into God's life, into the depth of his love for us. But our participation in the Eucharist is a challenge because when we receive Jesus, we commit ourselves to living like him: we commit to his values: we commit to loving God and our neighbour, to making our parish a more caring community, to help the needy and suffering, to work for justice and peace, to be merciful and compassionate. In a way, the REAL EUCHARIST begins for us when we leave the celebration. We are asked to "GO IN PEACE TO LOVE AND SERVE THE LORD". May we always reverence in prayer and adoration the beauty and gift of the Eucharist. May we become what we receive – the Body of Christ for one another. St. Bonaventure prayed this prayer: "Lord Jesus Christ, pierce my soul with your love so that I may always long for you alone, who are the bread of angels and the fulfilment of the soul's deepest desires. May my heart always hunger for you, so that my soul may be filled with the sweetness of your presence."

Kevin was born in 498, he lived and studied for the priesthood in Kilnamanagh one of our neighbouring parishes. After being ordained he came to Glendalough to follow his dream which was to find God in solitude and prayer. He lived the life of a hermit for 7 years, he had a deep love for nature and deep respect for all created things. He lived a very simple life, and soon became known as a holy man and others came to Glendalough to seek his advice, to be healed and to follow his way of life. Gradually small monastic communities were established, his fame as a teacher and holy man spread far and wide. Over time the monastic settlement at Glendalough grew to become one of the great Spiritual centres of Christianity in Ireland, flourishing for a thousand years after St. Kevin's death. You could take time out over the bank holiday weekend to travel to Glendalough which is a beautiful and peaceful place.


The Feast of the Most Sacred Heart of Jesus is on Friday 7th June
