Jimmy Fennell, our Parish Deacon, always available to assist. Thank you to the parish volunteers in the different ministries. I wish to thank the staff of the Parish, Parish Centre and the sacristy. Colette, Mary, Teresa, Bernadette, and many more volunteers who have helped to make St Agnes a muchloved Parish.

I wish to thank Karen for long being my PA. I would not have managed without her, bless you Karen and a thousand thanks. The growing issue of shortage of priests, as priests retire, it is difficult to find replacements which forces pressure on the remaining clergy.

I personally owe my vocation to my family, especially my uncle who was a priest to the Diocese of Glasgow.

Let us pray now for our priests and encourage any way we can for vocations to replace those who are retiring.

Liturgy of the Word

FIRST READING Is. 40:1-5.9-11

A reading from the prophet Isaiah.

'Console my people, console them' says your God. 'Speak to the heart of Jerusalem and call to her that her time of service is ended, that her sin is atoned for, that she has received from the hand of the Lord double punishment for all her crimes.' A voice cries, 'Prepare in the wilderness a way for the Lord. Make a straight highway for our God across the desert. Let every valley be filled in, every mountain and hill be laid low, let every cliff become a plain, and the ridges a valley, then the glory of the Lord shall be revealed and all mankind shall see it; for the mouth of the Lord has spoken.' Go up on a high mountain, joyful messenger to Zion. Shout with a loud voice, joyful messenger to Jerusalem. Shout without fear; say to the towns of Judah, 'Here is your God'. Here is the Lord coming with power, his arms subduing all things to him. The prize of his victory is with him, his trophies all go before him. He is like a shepherd feeding his flock, gathering lambs in his arms, holding them against his breast and leading to their rest the mother ewes
