90th ANNIVERSARY OF OUR CHURCH

This year, 2025, is the <u>90th</u> anniversary of the consecration and opening of St. Agnes Church. The date of consecration was the 10th February, 1935 by Archbishop Byrne. Our Parish Pastoral Council is preparing a few events throughout the year to mark this occasion. On Sunday, 2nd February, the 12.30pm mass will be a mass of Thanksgiving for the presence of the *Salesian Order* in our parish. The Salesians are an integral part of our Parish Community since their involvement from 1970 and have



contributed hugely to the development of our Parish and Church. To honour their presence and contribution we will unveil and bless a commissioned stained glass image of St. John Bosco, their founder, at the end of the mass on 2nd February. This will be followed by a cup of tea/coffee in our Parish Centre. Fr. Eunan McDonnell, Provincial of the Salesians, will be the main celebrant along with other Salesians.

ALL ARE WELCOME TO THIS MASS.

Our <u>NOVENA OF GRACE</u> this year, <u>4th-12th MARCH</u>, will be a time of reflecting on being a Parish Community and will be directed by Fr. John Walshe, a Dominican Priest based in Dominick Street. Our Parish Council is also organising an evening of celebration for all Parishioners who are involved in our Parish Ministry Groups and all who help out in different ways – Saturday, 10th May. In September we will initiate a painting/photographic competition for the schools in our Parish and in December this year we hope to have the choirs of our schools perform a concert in our Church. In October, we will have a Mass of Thanksgiving with Archbishop Farrell as the main celebrant. After our next meeting, 19th February, we will update you with further decisions and plans.


For coeliacs who would like to receive Holy Communion please inform the sacristan before Mass and let them know where you are sitting in the church.

Liturgy of the Word

SECOND READING 1 Cor. 12:4-11

A reading from the first letter of St. Paul to the Corinthians.

There is a variety of gifts but always the same Spirit; there are all sorts of service to be done, but always to the same Lord; working in all sorts of different ways in different people, it is the same God who is working in all of them. The particular way in which the Spirit is given to each person is for a good purpose. One may have the gift of preaching with wisdom given him by the Spirit; another may have the gift of preaching instruction given him by the same Spirit; and another the gift of faith given by the same Spirit; another again the gift of healing, through this one Spirit; one, the power of miracles; another, prophecy; another the gift of recognising spirits; another the gift of tongues and another the ability to interpret them. All these are the work of one and the same Spirit, who distributes different gifts to different people just as he chooses. The Word of the Lord. People: Thanks be to God.

GOSPEL ACCLAMATION Jn.6: 63.68

Alleluia, alleluia! Your words are spirit, Lord, and they are life; you have the message of eternal life. Alleluia!

GOSPEL Jn. 2:1-12

Priest: The Lord be with you **People: And with your Spirit** Priest: **A reading from the holy Gospel according to John. People: Glory to you O Lord.** There was a wedding at Cana in Galilee. The mother of Jesus was there, and Jesus and his disciples had also been invited. When they ran out of wine, since the wine provided for the wedding was all finished, the mother of Jesus said to him, "They have no wine." Jesus said, "Woman, why turn to me? My hour has not come yet." His mother said to the servants, "Do whatever he tells you." There were six stone water jars standing there, meant for the ablutions that are customary among the Jews; each could hold twenty of thirty gallons. Jesus said to the servants, "Fill the jars with water," and they filled them to the brim. "Draw some out now", he told them, "and take it to the steward." They did this; the steward tasted the water, and it had turned into wine. Having no idea where it came from - only the servants who had drawn the water knew - the steward called the bridegroom and said, "People generally serve the best wine first, and keep the cheaper sort till the guests have had plenty to drink; but you have kept the best wine till now." This was the first of the signs given by Jesus: it was given at Cana in Galilee. He let his glory be seen, and his disciples believed in him.

The Gospel of the Lord. People: Praise to you, Lord Jesus Christ.
